40 Years of Magic



SYNOPSIS

PROLOGUE: Like all good stories, this one begins with “Once Upon a Time.” The time is Christmas Eve many years ago. Everyone is making preparations for a festive Christmas party at the home of the Silberhaus family. Judge Silberhaus is a very important and respected figure in the town of Nuremberg. He and his wife have two beautiful children, Clara and Fritz.

Clara is a very lucky young lady. Her Godfather is Herr Drosselmeyer, a mysterious maker of toys. All of the children of the town love the wondrous toys he invents and are amazed each year by the unique gifts he brings to the party at the Silberhaus home. Herr Drosselmeyer is himself a curious fellow. He dresses in the fashion of his long past youth and carries himself with a mysterious air. The children and townspeople all treat him with much respect and admiration but are slightly frightened by his unusual ways.

ACT I - SCENE 1: “What a wonderful party this is turning out to be!” thinks Clara. Everyone is there, including all of Clara’s friends and relatives. The children are dressed in their best clothes and dance and parade around the room. But best of all, in the middle of the room stands a huge Christmas tree glistening with presents for everyone. Herr Drosselmeyer arrives laden with special treats and presents. For all the guests’ enjoyment, Drosselmeyer has brought three life-sized mechanical dolls and a Jack-in-the-Box. To Clara, he gives a beautiful Nutcracker, a most wondrous toy that is dressed like a handsome soldier. He has a white beard, and his mouth opens wide to crack nuts. Clara falls in love with the Nutcracker immediately.

As the festivities progress, Fritz tries to grab the Nutcracker away from Clara. In the struggle that ensues, the poor Nutcracker is broken. Before too many tears are shed, Herr Drosselmeyer comes to the rescue. Drosselmeyer is able to mend the Nutcracker and make Clara happy again. Clara vows to always keep her beloved Nutcracker safe from harm.

The hour is growing late. Everyone joins hands for a grande dance, even the three maids. As the dance is completed, the guests begin to depart one by one. Clara and her family go upstairs to bed to begin a night of sweet slumber and dreams of a wonderful evening.

SCENE 2: Clara awakens in the middle of the night and creeps into the parlor to fetch her beloved Nutcracker. Herr Drosselmeyer appears, along with Clara's beloved Nutcracker who has been transformed into a life-size commander of an army of toy soldiers.

Suddenly, Clara sees one giant mouse and then another. They are as large as the mechanical dolls Drosselmeyer brought to the party. The mice, led by the Mouse King, are preparing to attack the troop of life-size soldiers. A terrible battle follows, the worst in all toy history. Clara tries to help the soldiers and her beloved Nutcracker. She takes off her slipper and hits the Mouse King to distract his attention so the Nutcracker can attack him. The Nutcracker and the Mouse King both fall to the floor. When the mice see their leader has fallen, they scamper away, dragging their King with them.

The Nutcracker becomes transformed into a handsome prince. He bows to Clara and invites her to come with him on a journey to his home, the Land of Sweets and Spices, Confiturembourg.

SCENE 3: At the next moment, Clara and the Nutcracker Prince find themselves in the middle of a snowy forest, where winter never turns to spring. This is the Land of Snow. They are met by the Queen of Snow, who gives Clara and her Nutcracker Prince permission to pass through the White Forest on their journey to Confiturembourg. A dance begins with all the snowflakes whirling and twirling, creating a beautiful white snowstorm.

ACT II: Clara and the Nutcracker Prince arrive in a palace high atop Sugar Mountain in Confiturembourg. It is even more beautiful than Clara has imagined. The Sugar Plum Fairy dazzles Clara with her grace and elegance.

When the Fairy hears how Clara helped the Prince when he was battling the Mouse King, she crowns Clara as "Princess" and leads her to the Royal Throne. And then, best of all, she orders a festival in Clara's honor. At the end of the dancing, all the sweets and spices crowd into the courtyard to bid Clara farewell as she begins her journey home. On Christmas morning, Clara awakens with her beloved Nutcracker safe in her arms.



GUEST ARTIST

Carla S. Curet Auffant

Born in San Juan, Puerto Rico, Carla began her dance studies at the age of 5 at Yoly's Studio under the tutelage of Yolanda Muñoz. At the age of 14, she entered the Ballets de San Juan workshop. At the age of 17, she entered the Conservatory of Ballet Concert of Puerto Rico. In December 2004 Carla joined the Ballets de San Juan Company.

Carla has trained with teachers such as Yolanda Muñoz, Carmen Ana Rodríguez, Aurorita Hernández, among many others. In the summer of 2000, she attended the School of Cleveland San Jose Ballet Summer Dance program in Cleveland, Ohio; under the artistic direction of Dennis Nahat.

Her repertoire consists of classics, neoclassical, contemporary and modern. Among them is the ballet Nutcracker, Giselle, La Bayadere, Paquita, Romeo and Juliet, Carmen, Grand Pas de Quatre, Tarantella and Elegy by George Balanchine among others.

Carla holds a Bachelor of Art in History of the Americas from the University of Puerto Rico Rio Piedras Campus. She is currently continuing her graduate studies in the area of History of Puerto Rico and the Caribbean at said university. She works as the main soloist of the Ballets de San Juan company under the artistic direction of Nahir Medina and as a teacher at the San Juan School of Ballets directed by Marie Carmen Márquez. Carla travels extensively as an international guest ballerina.



GUEST ARTIST

Carlos G. Madera Martinez

Carlos G. Madera Martínez, born in Ponce, Puerto Rico, began dancing at the Puerto Rico School of Dance in Ponce at age 18 under the direction of Honey Defilló. In 1997 he became a member of the Ponce Musical Theater Ballet Company, directed by Julie Mayoral. In 2001 he joined the Ballet Señorial Compañía de Ponce, where he danced leading roles, under the direction of Grace Bigas.

Between 2005 and 2007, he joined the Puerto Rico Concert Ballet Company, in San Juan, as Principal Soloist, under the direction of Carlos Cabrera. From 2007 to 2012 he danced at the Brio de Bayamón Ballet Company, directed by Rodney Rivera as the main dancer, standing out in classical ballet as well as in contemporary pieces.

His repertoire includes many classical ballets, including *The Nutcracker*, *Sleeping Beauty*, *Coppelia*, *La Fille mal Gardee*, *Giselle*, *Don Quixote*, *Swan Lake*, *Cinderella* among others.

Mr. Carlos Madera earned his Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education and his Master's in Education and Administration. He currently works as a primary school teacher in the Department of Education in PR

Carlos has made guest appearances internationally. He first graced our stage for *Nutcracker* in 2017 dancing the role of Cavalier in *Nutcracker*. He and his wife Carla have taught intensive workshops at Staunton Academy of Ballet for three summers.
